Kim Haines-Eitzen is the H. Stanley Krusen Chair in World Religions as well as the Religious Studies Program Director at Cornell University. Her research explores how ambient sounds of the desert shaped early Christian monasticism and influenced religious imagination. Her work includes field recordings of the sounds of the American Southwest and Israel's southern deserts.

She is the author of *Guardians of Letters: Literacy, Power, and the Transmitters of Early Christian Literature*; *The Gendered Palimpsest: Women, Writing, and Representation in Early Christianity*; and recently *Sonorous Desert: What Deep Listening Taught Early Christian Monks and What It Can Teach Us*.
